

Greetings in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ!

Now we are in the season of Lent. In this season, I want all of us to think about our community of faith. God calls us to be in this community and belong to it. In this community we experience life together, whether it be good or not. Our church community is different from any other organizations because our life together comes from God and the Word of God. Our life together is possible through Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. In other words, we are united with one another in God through Jesus Christ.

For this reason, it is right to say that without Christ, there is no church. If Christ is not in a church, that church would be just a social club with group meetings and entertainment gatherings. Only through and in Christ, can the true church exist. Yes, Christ is the center of our faith community. When we gather together in the church, we meet in the presence of Christ. In the church, we receive gifts from Christ. We call it grace. The more we receive and experience grace as a gift from Christ, the more we are able to give to others in need and to forgive each other with love and respect.

Karl Barth, who is one of the greatest theologians of the 20th century, says, "Let God be God." He emphasizes a qualitative difference between God and human beings. He also criticizes previous theological trends, because many theologians saw God as the projection of human desire and absolute dependence of feeling, among other things. That theological trend also led to the belief that people could do anything they wanted to do. It helped human beings to see their positive destiny in the future. But after World War I and II, people started to rethink the relationship between God and humanity, for through both wars they found that there is no hope in human beings. In this darkest time, Karl Barth sees God differently and boldly proclaims, "Let God be God," because God has qualitative disparity over human beings.

Now it is time to rethink the church. The church should be the church by letting Christ be Christ, for the church is the body of Christ. God calls each one of us to be part of this sacred community of faith. Karl Barth's words still echo, "Let God be God."

"If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord."(Romans 14: 8)

A weekly meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous is held below the Sanctuary on Mondays at 8:00 p.m. If you or




someone you know needs support for their recovery, the Sunshine Group is a 12-step group meeting that is open to all seeking recovery.
