From the Pastor

Winter has a way of making itself known. The air sharpens, the days shorten, and the cold settles not just on our streets and sidewalks, but sometimes deep in our bones. We bundle up, turn up the heat, and look for ways to stay warm. Cold reminds us of our vulnerability—and of our need for shelter. The same can be true in our spiritual lives.

There are seasons when faith feels warm and alive, when hope comes easily and joy feels close at hand. And then there are colder seasons. Grief, uncertainty, isolation, and fear can chill our spirits. Relationships grow distant. Prayers feel unanswered. The world itself can seem cold—divided, harsh, and indifferent. I personally know that there are many of you experiencing trying times right now.

Scripture knows these seasons well. The psalms are full of cries from people who felt abandoned, numb, or exposed. The Bible never pretends that faith protects us from the cold; instead, it promises that God meets us in it and sees us through it.

One of the most powerful images of the gospel is that God does not shout warmth at us from a distance. God comes close. In Jesus, God steps into the chill of human life—into hunger, rejection, suffering, and death itself. The incarnation is God putting on flesh and entering the cold world we know so well.

If that is the case, then the church is called to be a place of warmth. Not perfect warmth, and not superficial cheer, but real, human warmth: presence, compassion, listening, and love. When someone walks through our doors carrying the cold of loss or loneliness, they should encounter a community that makes room by the fire. When the world feels unforgiving, the church should be a place where grace softens the air.

As the temperatures drop outside, may we pay attention to where warmth is needed inside. A phone call. A meal. A prayer. An invitation. These small acts can feel like a blanket offered at just the right moment.

Winter does not last forever. The cold is real, but it is not the final word. Spring will come. God's promise is not merely survival, but renewal—new life pushing up through frozen ground.

Until then, may we stay close to one another, and may the love of Christ keep us warm.
